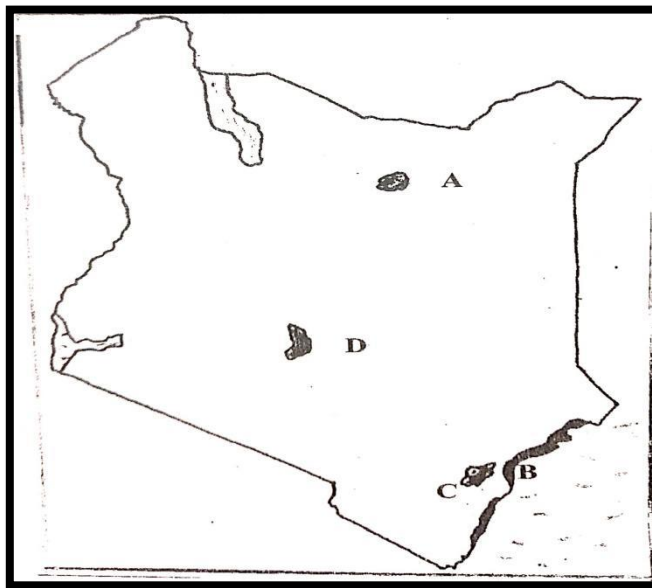

- d) Give two steps taken by Kenyan government to conserve wildlife. (2mks)

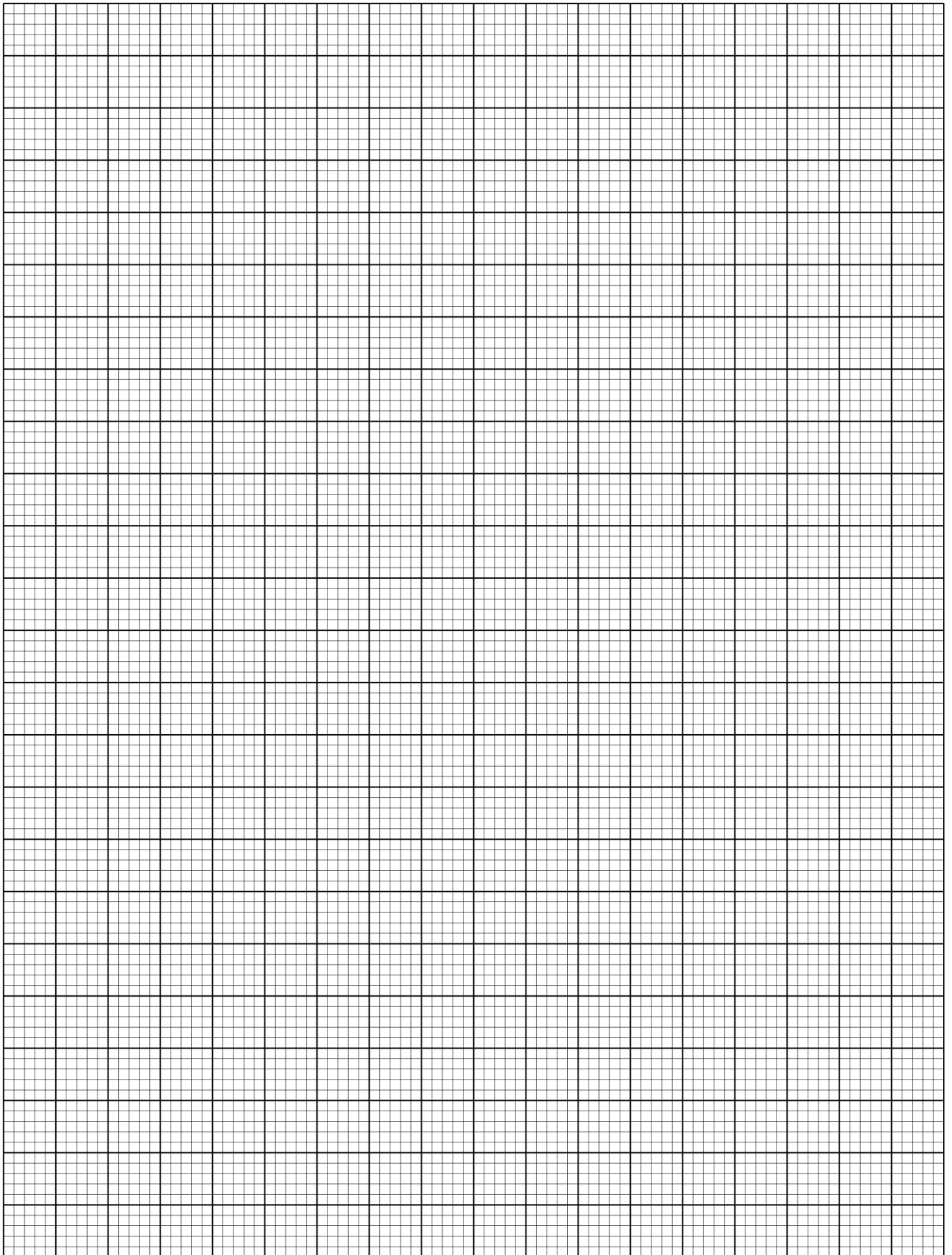
